<b>MARINA INFORMATION for CRUISE COORDINATORS</b>	
<b>Marina</b>	Genoa Bay Marina
<b>VHF</b>	66A, hail upon entering the bay.
<b>General</b>	Run by Will and Ben. A casual independent marina. About a 1-1/2 hour cruise from Tsehum Harbour.
<b>Dockage</b>	Club boats typically arranged along C dock, up to 700' can be available. Boats can also be on A, B, or D docks. All docks are long main docks that get closer together the closer to shore one gets.
<b>Power</b>	30 and 50 amp power in good condition and good number of outlets.
<b>Water</b>	Potable water is generally available, but very limited, check with office.
<b>Amenities</b>	A covered common area is by the foot of the ramp, next to the office / store. The covered area includes three large tables and three dozen chairs. The club often installs tarps over the south side in wet windy weather. The club's fire pits can be used in this covered area.
<b>Note</b>	Electric bike rentals are available from the store on the dock.
<b>Note</b>	There is an excellent café on shore; the Genoa Bay Café, reservations highly recommended.
<b>Note</b>	Genoa Bay is the site of the annual Sailpast event. This is because the bay itself is a large round basin ideal for getting the fleet into an organized line prior to sailing past and saluting the Commodore on his vessel. The Commodore's vessel is tied to the bay side of the sketchy dock that one passes on initial approach, OR at the sea side of A dock. Check with the office each visit to confirm where to moor the Commodore's vessel for Sailpast.
<b>Note</b>	A small locked kitchen is adjacent to the covered area. One can ask in advance to use this to prepare a dinner or brunch (when the marina is not using it), and, if granted, we need to keep it clean and locked. It is our custom to pay the marina \$50 cash for the use of the small kitchen.
